

#### What Is LIFE??



DKG California offers a unique opportunity for members to be involved in the legislative process by being a Bill Evaluator. This means members read bills before they go before the legislature

and offer their opinion on them. The recommendations of the Bill Evaluators are used by the DKG California Legislative Advocate, Martha Zaragoza Diaz, as she works for teachers and children in Sacramento.

If this sounds like something that interests you, there will be a Bill Evaluator Training (done electronically through Go To Meeting) on February 29. You will be trained by Martha in the comfort of your own home using your computer, laptop, phone or tablet.

This is a great way to influence what happens in Sacramento without ever leaving home!!



LIFE (Learning is for Everyone) is a non-profit foundation associated with DKG California but with a separate non-profit status and set of bylaws. LIFE's mission statement reads, "The mission of LIFE Foundation is to promote and support special projects related to learning and literacy within the State of California." Contributions sent to LIFE each year from our chapter's Buck a Book sales helps to fund the grants available through LIFE. Any teacher may apply for a LIFE GRANT, which is similar to our chapter's mini-grants - a grant to fund a teacher designed project to foster literacy and learning. LIFE also facilitates the privately fund-

ed Helene Going Green Award. This is only available to DKG members who are classroom teachers. This grant will fund a project that will create a desire in students to protect Planet Earth by reducing, refusing or recycling items that would otherwise fill landfills.

Both grant applications are due March 1st. More information and applications for these grants are available on the California DKG website, LIFE link. Consider applying for one of these grants. The grants are reviewed by the LIFE Foundation Board and are announced at the annual convention. I hope this explanation of LIFE is helpful to new and old members who may have wondered What is LIFE?
