Many of you told me how much you enjoyed Mom's Cheese Ball. Here's the recipe for anyone who would like it:

MOM'S BLEU CHEESE BALL

1/2 Stick butter or margarine, softened

8 ounce package cream cheese, softened

- 8 ounce package bleu cheese, crumbled
- 4 ½ ounce can chopped black olives, drained Tablespoon minced chives or green onions



Mix all ingredients well – I use my hand mixer to cream the cheeses and butter together and then blend in the olives and chives/onions

Spray small bowl with Pam (or other non-stick spray). Press mixture into bowl, pressing out "air bubbles." Chill until firm.

Turn out morning of use, or shortly before use. Sprinkle with chopped walnuts or almonds.

Mom used pecan halves, pressed into the ball. Serve with crackers.

Makes 3 cups.

Ball can be made 2 – 3 days before use and kept refrigerated I look forward to seeing everyone on January 11 for our first meeting of 2023.

Mini Grants Awarded!

The Beebe Nuetzman Mini Grant Committee was very pleased to consider 41 applications from the following school districts: Alhambra, Arcadia, Duarte (1 application, the teacher lives in Pasadena), Glendale, La Cañada, LAUSD, and Pasadena. Of the forty--one, 35 applications were fully or in partially funded. The total amount requested was \$17,383. A total of \$14.000 in grants was awarded. The successful applicants requested grants from these general categories: art (2), Computer software (2), Conferences (2),Cultural enrichment/Dual language (1),



Science Field trip (1), Garden tools and materials supporting science standards (2), Headphones for in class computer use (3), History and social studies (2), Literacy materials including books (7), Math materials (1), Music, (ukulele) (1), PE (Cricket material-the sport, not the insect), Science (3), Social/Emotional Learning(5), and Sensory materials for TK (2).

The committee is delighted to be able to fund so many excellent projects and ideas. We look forward to seeing their reports in the spring newsletters.
