Schools for Africa



Schools for Africa became an official project of DKG International in 2010. Since then members have donated approximately \$445,134.90 since the inception of the partnership with UNICEF USA. Currently the project works with 21 countries in sub-Saharan Africa including 21 countries: Botswana, Burundi, Chad, Cote d'Ivoire, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Eswatini, Ethiopia, Guinea-Bissau, Kenya, Lesotho, Liberia, Madagascar, Malawi, Mauritania, Mozambique, Namibia, Rwanda, Somalia, South Africa, Tanzania, and Uganda. The SFA mission involves providing access to quality basic education for children, focusing on girls, orphans and other vulnerable youngsters. World Fellowship



Women in non-member DKG countries may apply for a grant from the DKG World Fellowship program. They receive financial assistance to study in the United States or Canada. Chapters assist these women by offering them support while they are studying in North America. Often Chapter members send postcards or messages to the recipients. If one lives in proximity to a Chapter, members take her out to lunch or to an event or special place like Huntington Gardens. Members try to assist the World Fellowship recipient feel welcome and at home.

Women are changing this world. The World Fellowship Fund falls under the umbrella of the <u>DKG International Educators Foundation</u>. Thanks to the virtual DKG convention I had an opportunity to attend the annual LIFE board meeting and learned so much about this 21 year old foundation along with other DKG members! At each convention, an annual meeting is held to approve the minutes from the previous year, elect board members and provide a report on the year's activities. LIFE is alive and thriving due to your donations, which are the primary funding source. Our \$220 chapter donation will appear on next year's list of donors and we are very generous. Currently, LIFE has over \$30,000 which is used to award annual grants promoting literacy. This year almost \$8,000 was awarded to fund 12 grants. Imagine the support of literacy this foundation has made over the past 21 years with over 553 grants.

- There were no corrections needed to the February Minutes

So far the chapter has collected \$160 for the Life Foundation and Rose is willing to accept more if members are still willing to contribute. 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Thanks to the grant, I was able to purchase the Yoyo Chinese online materials for my classes. It has become a key part of the class to allow my students to learn Chinese with more interactive instruction during the online learning. For beginner levels such as level 1 and 2, the materials are able to teach students to write Chinese characters, to answer basic questions, and to communicate with each other through simple greetings and answers. For intermediate levels such as level 3, students are able to learn from more complex open-ended questions and more scenarios that are helpful for learning more about Chinese communication and culture. For AP class, many of the contents provide appropriate challenges and resources to the students to prepare for their upcoming AP exams. Last but not least, for the Chinese Business and Cinema class, the materials have included business themes for students to learn about, and it also has a large amount of video content for students to delve in deeper. Overall, the Yoyo Chinese includes various practices and contents for students to have more engagement and excitement while learning Chinese from distance learning. Students have shown increasing participation and enthusiasm for the topics. Besides purchasing the Yoyo Chinese, I have also purchased an air purifier and a glass divider. Even with the ongoing pandemic, students are expected to go back to school in person to conduct the AP exams in person. The air purifier and glass dividers will help minimize some risk for students to practice and conduct the upcoming exam in a safer





This program allows me to make every single slide interactive to keep student engagement high while giving me immediate feedback as well. I decided to purchase this program because I surveyed my students after 1st semester and the response was clear, they preferred Pear Deck over any other program I had used.
