



working directly with students online, helping with grading, assisting teachers with materials and activities, planning and evaluation

**THAT** volunteer activities allow us to remain connected to the field of education and continue to have a positive impact on students, fellow educators, and our local schools, whether we are retired or currently still working.

Our teachers in the frontlines have indicated some of their <u>current individual needs</u>, which I have included on the form available by clicking on the link.

If you are able to help any of our DKG teachers, please reach out to them directly, and let them know. If you are aware of other teachers, programs, or schools that could use our volunteer help, please share that information with me, and I will add it to our THAT Help Form next month.

To <u>record THAT hours</u>, select the **THAT** icon on the home page of the DKG California website (<u>www.dkgca.org</u>), or click on the blue link provided above. The form is very easy to fill out. All you need to do is enter your name and volunteer information, as well as Alpha Upsilon and Area XIII. Find a method that works for you to record your hours - - either record hours on an ongoing basis as soon as you provide a THAT service, or record your hours on a calendar or on your phone, and transfer them to the website at the end of the month. You will need to keep track of the hours you spend in THAT activities and record your hours by **March 1, 2022.**
